



Internship Opportunity

Research Intern

- Description:** Skatepark of Baltimore is looking for social science research student to develop and implement study of skateboarding community. He or she will also compile usage data gathered at the Roosevelt Park skatepark.
- Responsibilities:** Work with Board of Directors to identify factors of interest
Develop research plan and schedule;
Do background research;
Identify sample;
Develop survey;
Work with volunteer coordinator to train volunteers to conduct surveys;
Analyze data and write formal report;
- Qualifications:** Experience conducting a social science research project or coursework in research methods;
Ability to adhere to deadlines;
Access to necessary data analysis software;
Knowledge about Skatepark of Baltimore is preferred but not required- intern will receive a thorough formal introduction to the organization.
- Time:** Intern can expect to work 3-5 hours a week on this project. However, progress will be assessed by milestones in the research timeline. Intern will be expected to take as much time as necessary to complete the project. A report should be written within 3 months from start of project, although the intern is welcome to extend their position to do further research or evaluation.
- Evaluation:** Intern will meet bi-monthly with the President to develop goals and evaluate progress. Intern will be supervised primarily by the President, but also the rest of the Board of Directors. Intern should have a faculty or research advisor to help with technical issues.
- Benefits:** This position does not pay a salary, but it can be structured so that a student may receive school credit or service learning hours. Other benefits include resume experience, the opportunity to get letters of recommendation for school or work, the chance to network with Baltimore's non-profit and municipal sector.
